He Is Not Here By Pastor Phill

Busy month, April. Holy Week. Easter. Tax day. Many of you packing up and travelling north. Remember to take time to appreciate the gifts God gives in this season of the church year.

For me, first and foremost among those gifts is the Easter proof of the promises our Lord made to us in scripture – resurrection is real, Jesus is the Christ, God has a plan beyond this world, and in faith in Him you and I will share a resurrection like His. We who believe scripture is God's Word read the eyewitness accounts of the miracle of resurrection and understand we are to take comfort that we are, after all only strangers here, heaven is our home and we will be there when He is ready for us.

All of that makes me so sad that so many can't believe it, that throughout history so many have refused to believe. Hard to make someone believe what they have hardened their hearts against, but you and I know that Matthew did not invent the events of his gospel. Neither did John. How else but after a personal experience of resurrection could James, a doubter throughout his life with his half-brother Jesus, have been turned so completely he became the first "bishop" in Jerusalem? How could Paul turn so completely around that he left the comfort of position and home to trek the known world teaching of the Christ? Why else would Peter write his letters, and work with Mark to create that second gospel? How can anyone imagine the author of Hebrews made up all of which he writes without a certain knowledge of Christ's return from the dead? Those men wrote on three continents, over decades, telling the same story of a God who so loved the world that He sent His son to die for it, all of it.

This month we rejoice in the Good News of forgiveness, life and salvation in our risen Lord! Christ's birth, death and resurrection reveal how much God loves us. It also shows the great lengths He will go to forgive in order to bring us back to Him.

Forgiveness is not a hollow word. It can be tough to forgive. Imagine Christ on the cross crying out in His pain, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34) If we hold Christ and the forgiveness He extended in our hearts, we must also be willing to go to such lengths to forgive those we believe have hurt us. "For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." In the face of all of that, I find it easy to believe in even so unbelievable thing as resurrection from the dead.

I pray that you who do believe will find opportunity to exercise that faith in these last weeks of Lent and into Holy Week, either here among us or at that other place you call home. Join with us in celebrating the last Wednesday Lenten service, Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter weekend, and perhaps especially the fellowship of other Christians.

Nothing seems sacred or safe these days. The phone rings, you answer, and a voice says your computer is having problems, I'm from Microsoft, and I can help you if only you will let me in to your computer. Anyone who has allowed that has been sorry ever since... There have always been con men, folks who do not have the same sense of right and wrong we have, who live only to cheat you out of what is yours so it can be theirs, and these days there are many new ways to exercise their deception.

And the opportunities for identity theft have continued to multiply – even after you've gone to heaven! Hollis cut out an article underscoring that very point: seems that "ghosting," that is, stealing the identity of the deceased, is a current thing. Vitale lists several ways the unscrupulous can strike: filing phony tax returns, applying for loans, fraudulent credit accounts, etc. Seems that if too much information is revealed in obits, or obtained otherwise, the opportunity to steal that identity is very real. Once again we learn we live in the devil's playground, and we must be cautious in ways that would never occur to us.

And yet, in all of it, remember: Easter is a-comin'! May God's blessings be apparent to you in this season, and every season.

Microsleep Can Cause Problems

Microsleep happens when people are very tired and their brains begin to partially shut down. This will actually cause a period of temporary unconsciousness lasting from 1 to 30 seconds. This is an all-too-common factor in drowsy driving accidents. Microsleep was the cause of the Chernobyl nuclear explosion, the Valdez oil spill, and the space shuttle Challenger explosion.

Here are some signs: a blank stare, dropping the head and jerking it back up, slow and frequent blinking, a sudden jerk of the body, not being able to recall the last minute. You can prevent this by: taking a short nap of 20 minutes to refresh, pull off the road when you feel tired and schedule regular stops when driving, drink caffeinated beverages, use a co-pilot on long trips to help with driving.

Thoughts by Pastor Gary

"Do you hear what these children are saying?" (the chief priest and the teachers of the Law) asked Him. "Yes," replied Jesus, "have you never read, 'From the lips of children and infants you have ordained praise?'" (Matthew 21: 16)

Quite often parents save their toddlers from physical harm. Sometimes the roles are reversed as children save their parents.

"You forgot this," said a three-year-old son of a Maplewood, Missouri, policeman as the latter was getting ready to go on duty. He was bringing his father's bullet-proof vest. Later that evening, as the policeman was interrupting a burglary, he was shot – but the vest saved his life.

"A little child will lead them," wrote Isaiah in a prophecy of the Messiah's rule of peace (Is 11:6). The Lord Jesus likewise had good things to say about children, about those who believe in Him implicitly. He said adults should learn from them and believe as they did if they wanted to enter the kingdom of heaven. He commended the Palm Sunday children who were praising Him in the temple.

Perhaps in our life you can recount instances when children saved you, perhaps in a very real sense. In Canada a father was crushed under a car when the jack slipped. His young son, besides calling for help, used all his strength to lift up the car so that the father could breathe, thus saving his life. Children are a blessing to parents especially when they pray for them, set them the example of simple faith, and bring joy into the home. They can help save tottering marriages.

"Saved by a child" applies especially to our salvation in and by Jesus Christ. Isaiah prophesied of Him when he announced, "To us a Child is born, to us a Son is given" (Is 9:6). When Jesus was born in Bethlehem, the angel said to the shepherds, "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; He is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11). This Child, the Son of God, grew up to lead an obedient life on our behalf and on the cross to bear the consequences of our sins. Only in Him do we find forgiveness and peace with God.

Ask God in your prayers today to bless you with a childlike humility and with a strong faith in His son, our Savior Jesus Christ. And when you do, you shall have all the strength to lift up the entire world, thus saving your life and those of your children and grandchildren.

We meet on the third Monday of each month from September-May at 10:30 AM in the Conference Room.


LWML Update *by Barbie Aden, VP Communications*


