Strange Times! by Pastor Phill, Sr. Pastor

Now, this is a strange time in the life of the church, is it not? We are so fortunate as American Christians to take for granted our right to practice freely our faith – the experience of recent weeks ought to teach us not to take even religious freedom for granted. Apparently all it takes is one little bug – small as a virus – to interrupt our opportunity to gather as Christian friends.

Consider the plight of Christians elsewhere. Coptic Christians in Egypt are regularly killed, churches attacked, by militant members of the “religion of peace.” Pastors and others in India are at risk. In Africa groups such as Boko Haram regularly attack Christian worship. For example, on February 21 of this year, 3 churches were burned and members kidnapped.

And go back in time. The growing Christian church in the 1st century was not welcome in many places – consider Paul’s advice to the congregation at Rome to behave according to Caesar’s rules. Before that, that same Paul was known as the chief persecutor of Christians in Jerusalem and all over ancient Israel – that is, until Jesus got hold of Paul and straightened him out.

By comparison, as bad as I feel about suspending services, it could be worse.

Don't Catch the Coronavirus by Carol Steficek, Parish Nurse

Here are some dos and don'ts. Actually, these are good practices to follow ALL the time!

- In public places use your knuckle to press buttons, turn on light switches, etc.

Thoughts from Pastor Gary

Paul in writing to the Ephesians writes: "Put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then." (Eph. 6: 13-14)

We are living in uncertain times with all the latest health scares. "Stand firm then," Paul tells us, with the whole armor of God when the forces of evil attack us. Don't surrender; don't run away, stand!

The verb "stand" is used in many combinations. There is the call: "Stand up, stand up, for Jesus you soldiers of the cross." We do this when we bear witness of Him as the one crucified for the sins of all. We do this when in matters of faith we stand up to be counted. And we must do this as we together face difficult times.

A bit different is the emphasis in the charge to stand for – to stand for the principles of God's Word. It has been said that, unless we stand for something, we are apt to fall for anything.

An old spiritual declares that we Christians stand on the promises of God. We take our stand on the promises that God loves us in Christ, that He made us His children, that He cares, that He hears our prayers. One problem has been that some church members say they stand on the promises of God but then sit down on the promises when it comes to doing God's word.

For the movie industry comes the expression stand in. When the scene is being prepared, someone takes the place of the actor on the set. In Christian life, many needs and opportunities arise for us to stand in and fill someone's place – in church, at home, at work.

Finally, when a courtroom witness has completed his or her testimony, the judge tells that person to stand down. Everywhere in Christendom and the world, God has His witnesses and workers. He is pleased when they speak and work for Him. But the time comes when He says, "It is enough; it is time for you to stand down, to lay aside your tools, to come home."

I'm not sure what the next days, weeks, or months will become, but one thing I do know is that until that day comes, we need to "put on the full armor of God" and in faith "stand firm" and "stand up for Jesus."
