



Are Christian Values Still of Value?

What things did the Christ value? First, an enduring faith. He declares (John 6) that the will of His (and our) Father is that none of those given to Him will be lost, but will join the faithful in heaven. Faith in Him as our savior is the key there, a gift of God, a treasure of ours.

Next, the Sacraments, as instruments of God's grace. God gave us means, in baptism and the Supper, to recognize that our values are different from that of the world around us, increasingly so now. Where are those gifts, God's sacraments, offered? In the church. We are meant as His people to gather in celebration of our faith through God's grace. We do so now in new ways, gathered and scattered, strange for us, and yet His word is proclaimed to all who will listen in any way.

The Commandments are the very definition of Christian values, given in the desert to God's people, reiterated and amplified on the mountainside by Jesus (Matthew 5 and 6). Let's not forget the Golden Rule, Matthew 7: "So that whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets." As Jesus values us, so He asks us to value others.

We look around and realize that apparently very few Americans still hold these things as true and useful. Perhaps it is only because we almost never hear, in our wonderful media, of people or organizations that revere and support the values above. It seems that for so many, Christian values have no value any more.

American society has undertaken to distance itself from the teachings of Scripture, for example redefining marriage, attempting to dictate what persons must be hired in religious organizations regardless of whether those persons understand and support the teachings of the church, etc. There have been some moments of rationality – the Court decided a state could not discriminate against a religious school in denying it funds for playground renovation, as one example. Generally, though, it seems that government has taken to accepting, even promoting, behavior that runs counter to Biblical principles. An example: deciding that destructive, violent rioting is protected by the Constitutional right to peaceful assembly. Personal responsibility as envisioned by those Commandments seems to have become an anachronism, ancient words that are meaningless in a "woke" society.

In this political season you will not hear me advocate for a particular candidate for any office. You will hear me ask you, the voting Christian, to look into your hearts for what is right and wrong. You will hear me ask you to determine what a party or candidate stands for, examine how a platform embraced by a party or candidate supports or undermines the Biblical, Christian values we hold. I will ask you to apply a Biblical world view to the intense spiritual warfare being waged around us in this nation. And if you choose not to apply those tests as you vote, that is your right as an American citizen, a right people have fought and died for.

May God continue to so richly bless this nation and her people, and especially you and me as individuals of faith in a time of challenge to that faith.

There's a story told about a young boy who was shooting rocks with his new slingshot. He could never hit his target. One day he was staying with his Grandma and little sister Sally. On that day he spied his Grandma's prized duck in the yard and without blinking an eye; he took dead aim at the duck and let the rock fly from his slingshot. The rock hit its mark and the duck was dead. The boy panicked and hid the duck in the woodpile only to look up and see his sister standing there. After lunch that day, Grandma told Sally to help with the dishes and Sally responded "Johnny told me he would help you today". Johnny didn't want to do the dishes, yet Sally whispered to him "Remember the duck!" So, Johnny did the dishes.



The Singers and Ringers of Crown of Life

The repertoire for Crown of Life Choir and Crown of Life Handbell Ringers has always been selected, ordered and in the music room long before this time of the year. That is – in a normal year. However, as we ALL KNOW this is anything but a normal year. Based on the uncertainties of our current public health situation, music repertoire ideas are greatly alive in the director’s mind, on his desk and on his piano. The music is there, however, anxiously awaiting the proper time for it to be purchased, introduced, rehearsed and presented in worship.

We are taking a measured step-by-step approach to getting the Crown of Life Choir and Ringers back into our Saturday and Sunday worship services.

Step One: Thursday, September 10 – 2:00 pm - Four Handbell Ringers will meet in the sanctuary to experiment with ringing from separated tables. If it goes well, we’ll continue Thursday rehearsals and be part of a couple of worship services in October, November and December, including the Musical Christmas Celebration services.

Step Two: Select 16 singers (from those indicating interest) who will begin preparing and committing to be part of our Musical Christmas Celebration services in December. Music will be mailed to the singers.

Step Three: The 16 Christmas Singers begin rehearsing together (in sanctuary, with distancing) on Thursday, October 1 at 3:30 for a 45 minutes rehearsal.

THE ENTIRE CONGREGATION is invited to pray for each of us who will be involved in this process. Our desire is to once again make God’s praise GLORIOUS in the COL sanctuary, but in a safe and effective manner.


