From Pastor Phill

Now, here is something you don't know: we have kids here. Yup, every Monday morning we become a school site, for a day. The story is...

In July a Christian home-school group came to see us, looking for a place for their students one day a week (the other 4 days are taught in their homes). They had been at another church, the building was sold, and they were homeless. This is a very organized group called Schole Academy, and they teach in a classical way now lost to our public system. If you're interested, here is the website for the national organization: <https://scholeacademy.com/>

Locally, and weekly here at Crown, there are 42 students and 13 parents on campus, using spaces available such as the Sanctuary, Narthex, Chapel, Music Room, and Parish Hall for classroom space. Each of the parents spends the school day here with the kids, and each of the parents teach a subject in the various class levels, preschool through middle school. The curriculum includes Latin, if you can imagine that these days, history, math, English (grammar, yet!), in short, all the subjects you remember when you were in school.

The school day begins in a way unique to schools these days: an opening prayer, Pledge of Allegiance, and the Common Doxology. Like I said, Christian. The day ends with each mom/teacher assigned a clean-up task (trash detail, sanitizing surfaces, putting the place back in the order in which they found it, etc.). They are quite organized. They have a liability policy; we are additionally insured on that policy as we need to be.

They have pledged to be good neighbors, and take care of our facility as their own. I will monitor that they do exactly that. In my heart, and with the agreement of Elders and Council, I see this as a mission/outreach opportunity. We will not add members through this - these families all have church homes; they are not paying us for the use of the facility so we are supplying the electricity necessary during their one day weekly on campus. And with all that, in our judgement this is a good gift to give to Christian kids and families.

A natural question has come up: with Carol Steficek having left Crown, will we seek to replace her position as Parish Nurse? Not yet. I do believe we have a need for an active parish nurse here, and in this time of Covid, Carol was not able to do her job calling on people in hospital or rehab, organizing on campus events, etc. As the world begins to open up again - when? - we will, consulting with Church Council, seek another Parish Nurse. We will leave the position in the 2021 Corporate Ministry Plan, the budget, and pray God will provide the opportunity and the person.


Ladies of COL

Thoughts from Pastor Gary

People use looks and hand motions – “body language” – to convey much in order to save on words. In writing, too, one can practice utmost word economy. After Victor Hugo had written his novel *Les Miserables*, he was anxious to know how it was selling. He wrote his publisher, “?” and the publisher replied, “!”

How does God communicate with us? In the realm of nature, He does it without words. In what we see before our eyes – mountains, seas, vegetation, living beings, and the heavenly bodies – He reveals His wisdom and power.

Nature, however, tells us nothing about God’s love and compassion. For that we need God’s words. In the Old Testament, God spoke through the prophets, in both their spoken and written words. St. Peter writes, “Men spoke from God as they were carried along (moved, inspired) by the Holy Spirit” (2 Peter 1:21). In words the prophets declared that God in His underserved mercy and compassion would save His people through His Son, the promised Messiah.

The writer of the book of Hebrews (1:1-2) states that God, having spoken to our forefathers through the prophets, has now once for all “spoken to us by His Son.” This Son, in the prologue of John’s gospel, is called the Word. God spoke to us through the person of His Son, and what a message it is! God so loved the world that He gave his only Son as its Savior. What is more, God speaks to us through the words that Jesus spoke. These are the words of the Holy Scriptures, of which Jesus said that they testified of Him. In the Bible, which includes also the writings of the evangelists and apostles, we have God’s Word given to us in words. These words tell us that God was in Christ, through whom He reconciled the world to Himself. Precious words indeed, for they include us in God’s every promise of salvation!

Pray today and each day that the Holy Spirit will open your heart and mind to the Scriptures as Jesus did to the Emmaus disciples, so that each day you may come to know Him better.

Crown of Life Quilters Corner News

As of September 15th, we have donated 127 quilts and blankets to 2 organizations. 92 quilts were donated to the Arizona Sunshine Angels Foster Care for Children. This is a charitable organization that exists to support and enrich the lives of Arizona foster children in the care of residential group homes in Maricopa County. There are 300+ children, ages 3-18 residing in 37 facilities of group homes. The Arizona Sunshine Angels have been volunteering and helping foster children since 1999. Officially becoming a charitable organization in March 2006. They serve foster children through outreach and positive interaction to promote their health and healing. Through their presence the children learn that they are loved.

The other 35 quilts were donated to the "Streetlight USA". This foundation provides crisis intervention, stabilization and housing for girls ages 11-17 who are at risk for or victims of child sex trafficking. Their mission is to anchor in a Christ driven desire to shine light, show love, and encourage young girls as they walk the path of healing.

You have been there for us with your prayers, support and generosity. We will surely miss you all, but we will see you again, one day, with our Savior and Lord. May God bless all of you!



A good way to start is by learning what emotions are normal and to be expected when facing the holidays without your loved one. It is *normal* to feel overwhelmed as the holiday season approaches, and when you *know* what to expect, you won’t be rendered helpless and overwhelmed as holiday events trigger unexpected emotions.
