From Pastor Phill

In a few short weeks (Sunday, November 15) we will convene our November Voters' Assembly, one of two our constitution mandates annually. This one asks that the congregation vote in the slate of candidates to serve as officers, Elders, and Trustees. Also, importantly, is the presentation and acceptance of our Corporate Ministry Plan – the budget – for 2021, and updates on our current financial position.

You'll have in your hands, available at church services, the packet of information you'll need for the meeting. Look for those packets the weekend of the 30th October and 1st November. Folks who have come into membership at Crown since our last Voters' Assembly are asked to sign the Constitution, sort of a rite of passage into voting membership here.

A difference you'll note immediately is that the Assembly will be held in the Sanctuary, so that we can be comfortably distanced. And, we won't be signing in as individual voters as that always creates a lengthy line and we do want to stay distanced.

Last November it was announced that a Task Force had been formed to take a look at Crown, our operations, our future. This November we'll have some discussion as to recommendations that group has brought to the Church Council. Nothing earth-shaking, mind you, but are there ways we can improve the governance of our parish? Of course. So, look forward to that conversation on the 15 November.



The end of November marks the beginning of a new Church Year, and the arrival of Advent. We will have three Advent mid-week services in December as always, and the church will be decorated for the Christmas season. We'll witness the lighting of the Advent wreath as well. Folks are sometimes a little confused by the Scripture readings in Advent, as they reflect the Triumphant entry into Jerusalem, beginning with, on November 28 and 29, Mark 11:1-10. What does the preparation for Easter have to do with the preparation for Christmas? Exactly this: while we may not want to think about the sacrifice on the cross while we're expecting the birth of the Christ Child, that cross is why we have Christmas. He was, after all, born that He might die for us. Tough mission, but necessary for our salvation.

President's Message

First of all, let me welcome back our snowbirds. Hopefully your time away from COL was enjoyable (even under the Covid 19 restrictions).

Crown of Life is alive and well. Changes in personnel include Holly Gast, church administrator, and Bob Coursen, principal organist. Thanks be to God for bringing these people to our church.

The church council is currently reviewing the recommendations for the next five years of the COL Task Force and selected Governance as priority for discussion, review and possible revision. Governance documents to be reviewed include the constitution, the by-laws, and the congregational operations manual. Items to be considered include:

- who can authorize and sign contracts
- a personnel committee for the oversight of COL personnel management
- develop and monitor a standardized process for changing, adding or deleting operational procedures
- a budget commission to provide financial management recommendations and assist in preparation of the annual budget; and to give a clear picture to the church council and voters of COL's finances.

Additional information concerning task force recommendations will be presented at the NOVEMBER 15 Voters Assembly.

Beyond Easter, also, is the promise of His imminent, final return to Earth. Enjoy this month of cooler weather and coming celebration, enjoy it in good health and God's grace, and enjoy it in the certainty of God's plan for His people and His Earth.

Thoughts from Pastor Gary

People are not by nature thankful. For many, ingratitude is a step in the journey of moral and spiritual decline. Paul points out in Romans 1:21 how it went with pagan nations: "Although they knew God, they neither glorified Him as God nor gave thanks to Him." Then they follow other sins to which God in His judgment abandons them.

The Children of Israel, God's own people, were likewise notorious for their un-thankfulness. God declares through Isaiah, "The ox knows his master, the donkey his owner's manger, but Israel does not know, My people do not understand. Ah, sinful nation..." (Is. 1:3-4). Israel did not stop to consider that "every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights" (James 1:17).

The nine leprosy Israelites whom Christ had healed but who did not return to say thanks ran true to form. Our Lord felt hurt: "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine?" Only one man, a non-Israelite, was grateful — declared himself so by word and deed.

We have many reasons to be grateful. The one reason that stands like Mount Everest above all others is our healing from the leprosy of sin. Jesus went to another mount — Calvary — to shed His blood that cleanses us from all sin. In gratitude we do what the Samaritan did: turn back, praise God with a loud voice, and at Jesus' feet give thanks. That's why we are in church each week. That's why we are thankful in our homes as we gather about well-laden tables and enjoy family fellowship on Thanksgiving Day. We cannot but give thanks to God for all His benefits to us.

As you gather with family and friends on Thanksgiving Day, in your table prayer, enumerate the main blessings you have received from God and thank Him for them, especially for your salvation in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Stephen Ministry - The Art of Listening

The most important skill that Stephen Ministers have been trained to understand and use is simply **Listening** and caring. A Stephen Minister spends a considerable amount of time in this training. Listening is a powerful care giving tool. If a Stephen Minister listens well, he or she will be highly effective in this endeavor. The art of listening to a person when dealing with a problem can be therapeutic. Listening is an active process that requires much personal involvement and commitment. The Stephen Minister's mind and heart must be attentive to its fullest and caring for the person, totally. The attributes a Stephen Minister must have are desire, commitment, patience, and above all Christian Love for that person. You must really want to hear what is being said, and commitment shows you care. Patience in your listening takes time, and that you are there to actively listen. The Stephen Minister must seek to understand as completely as possible how the person views or relates to his or her world. Listening also means noticing what is not said. Active listening is a way of understanding what others communicate and of helping them understand themselves better. In conclusion, Crown of Life Stephen Ministers have been well trained and are very caring people.

Listening to God is likewise important to Stephen Ministers. God is our refuge and strength. The Lord Almighty is always with us (**Psalm 46**). The best way for us to listen to God is through prayer. One scripture that always traces through my mind is: **What, then, shall we say in response to this? If God is for us, who can be against us (Romans 8:26-39)?**

We continue to encourage you to stay safe and take the appropriate precautions. We also invite you to join us in praying for all affected by the virus. The love of God through His loving Son is stronger than ever. May the Lord bless you and keep you safely under God's umbrella.

Instead of serving a "sit-down" dinner in the Parish Hall, prepared "To-Go" dinners can be picked up on Christmas Day for you to enjoy. We will be following all of the CDC guidelines to insure health and safety for all.

- The **menu** isn't changing. **Turkey Dinner** includes turkey, dressing/stuffing, mashed potatoes, green bean casserole, cranberry sauce, turkey gravy, and a King's Hawaiian roll. **Ham Dinner** includes ham, scalloped potatoes, sweet potatoes, green bean casserole, cranberry sauce, spiced apples, and a King's Hawaiian roll. For **Dessert**, you'll have a choice of a slice of Pumpkin or Apple pie.
- The **price** isn't changing. It's still only \$10 per delicious dinner including dessert.

Honoring God and our Loved Ones through this Holiday Season

Under the best of circumstances, the holiday season can be intensely painful for those grieving the loss of a loved one. This year we also have to deal with the disruption and physical distancing Covid-19 presents. However, there are many helpful (and creative) strategies that can help you get through this holiday season and even experience moments of joy and gratitude.

We will cover these strategies and consider new strategies for dealing with this holiday season at our **Surviving the Holidays Seminar on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. (via Zoom).**

These are a few helpful suggestions for this holiday season:

- **ACCEPT YOUR PAIN.** The pain of your loss is unavoidable at this time of year. Healing takes time. Some situations may trigger painful emotions. This is normal. Remind yourself that it is a season and it will pass. Journal your emotions
- **COPING STRATEGIES.** Have the phone numbers of your counselor, pastor, church, close friend or hotline next to your phone. Make the commitment to call someone if negative thoughts get too intense. Trained crisis counselors are available at any time of the day by calling 2-1-1 (www.resilient Arizona.org)
- **EXPECTATIONS.** Lower your expectations. Movies, songs and holiday promotions create an unrealistic picture of the holidays.
- **GET UP AND MOVE.** Take care of your physical well-being. Healthy foods will give you strength. Exercise is a natural stress reducer.
- **GOD.** Turn to God in prayer and to God's Word for daily strength, inspiration and comfort.
- **GRATITUDE.** Focus on everything for which you are grateful. Journal your gratitude.
- **REACH OUT.** Reach out to other people who might be alone during the holidays through the means available to you, whether that is by phone, email, Zoom, Skype, Face Time, cards, and snail mail.
- **SET BOUNDARIES.** Explain to your family and friends what you are capable of doing this year, and what you aren't capable of doing.
- **SOCIALIZE.** This year you may have to be more creative in connecting with family and friends. Guidelines are to keep gatherings small and to take all the suggested precautions. Many people are finding enjoyable time together by visiting with each other via Zoom, Skype and Face Time amid this year's concerns with the pandemic. Physically distancing doesn't mean socially distancing.



When our grandson Alex lived with us for a year at a young age, one of his favorite bedtime stories was Goodnight Moon. It is a story of personal observations about things found in a child's room, told in a certain sequence easy for children to memorize, because it gives them assurance that nothing is forgotten.

God did give us the sun by day and the moon by night, to keep the seasons in order. Let us praise His Holy Name and thank Him for all His creation!


