The Future Is...?

A good question was asked of me after church last week: When we've all been vaccinated, will we still have to wear masks to church?

Now, I can't predict the future of such a thing as a pandemic – before last year I don't think I ever used the word in a sentence. But I'm fairly confident that the simple answer to that good question is: yes, you'll still have to wear masks in church, over your mouth and your nose, please. I don't know when, or from whom, or how, the "all clear" will be sounded. Someday, I pray, the masks can come off, and I'm certain it will not be pastors that declare the emergency has ended. That's not great news, I know – masks bug me too – and for the foreseeable future masks will remain our protocol.

So will wiping down surfaces after church services. You've been great about taking a few moments to do that; I believe it is a visible indicator that your safety matters to your church. Likewise two services on Sunday. We could now, and have in the past, seated the current Sunday total attendance in one service. Folks, I like that there are spaces between us in the pews these days – much as I love a full church, now is not yet the time.

Communion is another topic of discussion and disagreement. For some what we're doing does not seem worshipful, I know. Other parishes have other solutions; many parishes in our community are closed altogether and I pray our measures to mitigate transmission and remain open will be, if not ideal for you, at least acceptable.

The further future for Christians I can predict. I have a manual that describes it. Here is Paul writing first about a present reality:

But now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been known, to which the Law and Prophets testify. This righteousness comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. Romans 3:21-22

And then Paul speaks of a future in an unknown time:

For the Lord Himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. 1Thessalonians 4:16

John the Apostle, after seeing and writing about awful and frightening things the Lord has in store for His earth, has this vision:

Thoughts from Pastor Gary

Helen Traubel, an operatic and concert soprano, also wrote two mystery novels. Thomas Jefferson was a lawyer, political philosopher and scientific farmer, as well as a statesman. Martin Luther was a theologian, linguist, and hymn writer. The comic Red Skelton painted clowns.

Some people have multiple talents; others have fewer. Jesus draws on this obvious reality in a parable of a property owner who entrusted five, two, and one talent to three of his servants.

When you count up your talents, don't limit yourself to the musical or literary, to the scientific or the popular. God's talents given to us include many kinds, like group-leadership ability, creative housekeeping, friendliness, being good in a repair shop, being a healer of hurts by words and deeds.

God gives us talents for a reason: to equip us for service. Just as eyes and ears, hands and feet, mind and muscles are differently equipped so that they can serve the whole human being, God equips us for the good of all – be that in church, community, society, state, or the business world.

Talents vary also in degree. We may not be able to sing arias or write novels, but we can nevertheless sing to the glory of God in worship and at home, and we can write encouraging letters and notes to people who need uplifting. This, too, is using our talents as good stewards. St. Paul puts it all into one package for us: "It is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful" (1 Cor. 4:2).

The motivation for that, like the talents themselves, comes from God, who made us and who, through Christ Jesus, redeemed us. In love to Him who first loved us we serve Him and one another with our talents.

In your prayers this evening, ask that God will help you to discover your talents and to give you the willingness to use them for Him and for others.

The most important and meaningful guide for a Stephen Minister to follow is the Caregiver's Compass. Last month we looked at Compassionate and Full of Faith. This month we look at Skilled and Trustworthy.

What does it mean for a Stephen Minister to be Skilled? A lot of time is spent to develop skills in communications. We must be able to respond to a situation properly. We need to know our bounds when communicating to our Care receiver. Above all, we need to know how to pray, and to always select the proper scripture for emphasis and discussion.

For the last part of our Compass, a Stephen Minister must be Trustworthy in all aspects of care giving. We show and demonstrate that we can be trusted with confidential information. Above all, we must respect the privacy of our conversation. Another important element is being faithful in our attendance and timeliness.....to be 100% reliable and committed to serving as a Stephen Minister. After all, this is what our God through Jesus expects of Christians.

To single out a Primary Goal for Stephen Ministers, it has to be to learn all of the proper skills taught us and practice them with due diligence. All Stephen Ministers follow and practice these Compass principles, religiously.

Thank you for making this instant communication with the Father possible by shedding your blood on the cross – the once-for-all atoning sacrifice for my sin, present and future, (past sins forgotten). I come to you in contrition and you, Abba Father, with the Holy Spirit, are part of the conversation.

You hear me and you listen to my plea with your whole heart, without interruption. You quiet me with your love. 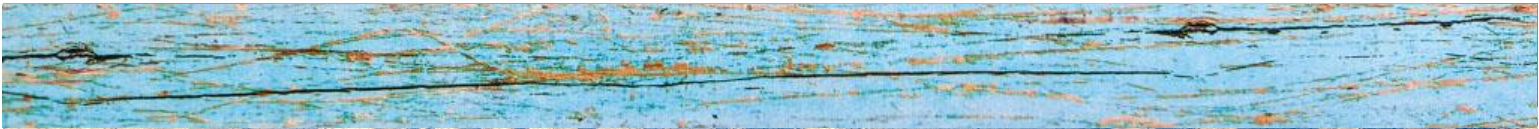
