From Pastor Phill

Easter is early this year, April 4. Next year, later – April 17, after tax day for a change. Now I know you'll be seeing what follows elsewhere, in the bulletins, on the screens, later in these pages, but there are some things I'd like you to know about our Easter celebration this year.

The early, outside service has been moved inside, at 7:30AM, in order to provide more safe seating. As much as I love the sunrise service, we can't find a way to distance the usual 70 people on the patio, and a 7:30AM in the Sanctuary will provide more space and more seats. There will be special music at that service as always for the early Easter gathering. Between the services Sunday morning we will be setting out some snacks and coffee, again not the usual feed, but nice just the same.

Roger has arranged for a mini-concert of the brass and organ before the 4PM, 9AM and the 10:30AM services begin, so be prepared to hear some extra music this year, in addition, of course, to the choir and the bells. With all the above, we pray you'll be blessed by our Easter services this year, unlike last, actually happening on Easter!

The United Methodist Church in America has announced that before 2024 they will split into four separate denominations, thereby exploding forever the idea they are united in any way. In a publication entitled "Forward" the church has indicated the general focus of each of the four groups: Traditionalist Methodist Church, Moderate Methodist Church, Progressive Methodist Church, and Liberation Methodist Church. Each of these new denominations will be able to choose their own title, service styles, constitutions, theology and practice, etc.

Item Four of the announcement, the Transitional Council, reads as follows:

Transitional Council – There shall be a Transitional Council that develops the above-named Plan of Separation according to the values of self-determination, equitable distribution of general church assets, restorative justice, and reparations.

What is happening is that yet another main-line denomination in this country is taking leave of allegiance to Scripture, and deciding for itself, for its new selves, that God did not mean what He said in the Bible we call Holy. They feel that as the culture around us changes, the message of the Holy Spirit must change with it to accommodate the new mores and expectations of society. I am reminded of what the former Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church in America, Katharine Jefferts Schori, once said: "The Holy Spirit is speaking to us in a whole new way," thereby giving permission to that church to abandon the traditional understanding of Scripture.

The Role – assess and shape strategical and long-term direction, evaluate church doctrine, protect church unity, and oversee administrative functions of the church. (Compare it to the Board of Directors of a corporation.)

Members are vetted by the Senior Pastor and voted on by the church body at a Voters Meeting.

Selection criteria – Council members chosen by the church body should be Christian servants and role models with exhibited spiritual gifts that lend to, among others, leadership, wisdom, and administration (based on Acts 6:1-6 and Timothy 3).

Responsibilities –

- Pray & protect church unity
- Shape long-term unity
- Advise Senior Pastor
- Oversee administrative functions of the church
- Follow duties as set forth in other articles and Bylaws.

Thoughts from Pastor Gary

How afraid we can be of death! We don't like going to the doctor because we're afraid he might find something that will end up killing us. We don't like to talk about diseases such as cancer or heart trouble because they can so often be fatal. Medicine that comes from a syringe or in a bottle may help keep us alive, but not forever. We need resurrection medicine.

Where can we find it? The same place the disciples did that first Easter. “The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord.” (John 20:20) For them resurrection medicine came in the form of the living Lord. For you and me it is the written Word. They saw the risen Jesus in person; we see Jesus with the eyes of faith. Through the Word Jesus stands before us, just as surely today as He did before the disciples in the locked room. Through the Word Jesus speaks His promises of sin pardoned, death put to flight, and heaven flung wide open just as surely to you and me as to those first believers. I can get His very necessary resurrection medicine through regular dosages of His Word.

“Pastor, I can't lose,” said the hospitalized Christian facing serious surgery. “Either the surgery will be successful and Jesus will let me live a bit longer for Him, or Jesus will take me to live with Him forever.” She knew about resurrection medicine. For her it made all the difference in life and death. Time for all of us to shake the bottle of His Word and use the only medicine that can make us live forever.

Pray today and every day that Jesus, through His Word, will fill us with His life saving resurrection medicine.

Thank You from LWML!



Prayer for the Love of Family

“Family is at the center of life’s meaning. Individuals linked together by a golden chain of love, like a never-ending hug, family encircles each member with steadfast devotion and enduring love. Family celebrates triumphs and shares adversities across generations and across miles. Family is belonging to and believing in each other.” These words are imprinted just like that around the frame of a picture that shows a beloved son and grandson sitting on a water craft, stopped long enough at Bear Lake, for me to take their picture during a vacation together.

It is true that our God of love and grace gave us family, someone to love and be loved by, to not be alone – an island by ourselves in a vast space of time. He wanted us as part of *His* family, belonging and believing in His goodness. Man broke that trust and since then, with His help, has given us a blueprint to reconcile - His Word, His Spirit, the treasure of His Son, and communication through prayer.

Love is given a chance when we decide to write that note, make that phone call, send that email. Oh Lord, make us willing to follow the example of your dear Son Jesus and be more like him.


