From Pastor Phill

Of first importance to us as summer comes to an end is to announce the resignation of Roger Hicks, our Choir Director, after 7 years. I know you have appreciated the contributions his ministry has made to our worship, as have I. He, and Jean, will be missed. Crown needs its choir, and shortly we will begin the process of seeking a new Choir Director, which will take time. In the meantime, Holly Gast has accepted the position of Interim Choir Director. Holly has a background, education, and training in music. This will be a different season for our choir, a season to take us from where we have been to where the Lord will lead next. Holly and the choir will begin practices this month of September, and we should hear from them soon.

Schole, the home school group that meets once weekly on our campus, returns on September 9, Thursday, a new day for them. They have moved from Mondays to accommodate our Women's Bible Study in the Parish Hall on that day. The parents of those Schole students, there are about 50 of them, each take a subject and grade level to teach, and it really is a team and family effort. You will remember Elders and Council approved their presence on campus a year ago, and now begins another academic year. Schole is a nationwide movement of Christian home-schoolers, and we welcome them back.

Here is a teaser on another subject, a full announcement coming soon: Holly is arranging a Shredding Event, utilizing a truck mounted shredder, in October. She has been sorting and organizing, and has many boxes of ancient records of which to dispose. The plan is to invite your shred-able stuff too, and combine it with an ice cream social or some such Lutheran church activity. Sounds like a great combination, doesn't it?

The "social" part of that is in the hands of the Assimilation Team, which has begun meeting after so long a hiatus. They are working on outings and activities, again, a return to what used to be normal.

And what if normal falls apart again? We, like you, continue to monitor the Covid situation locally. If there is a tremendous turn for the worse in cases (currently about 2000/day in our county of 4 ½ million people) we can return to the precautions of a year ago, masks, distancing, etc. For now, we feel as though our parish continues to be a safe haven in a crazy world.
