From Pastor Phill

Welcome to November, a busy month at Crown of Life Lutheran Church. The end of this month signals the end of the Church Year, and the beginning of Advent. Working backwards, the annual Soup Supper and Hymn Sing happens after Saturday service, the 25th of November.

Keep coming this way: Thanksgiving communion service is 4PM November 22. Before that, November 19, 4PM Sunday afternoon, is a concert arranged by our Bob Coursen, featuring the professional musicians that grace us during the summer. And don't forget the Voters' Assembly, November 12 immediately following the Sunday service, that's a biggie. The day before that is Veterans' Day, 11/11 – we have many vets here at Crown.

So that's an upside down look at this month, that begins with Reformation and ends with Advent. May God bless your worship in this eventful few weeks!

During the fall Voters' Assembly we present the slate of candidates standing for office, as well as the corporate ministry plan, the budget, for 2024. The church's expenditures typically increase incrementally, as do your personal expenditures – seems like no price ever stays the same. Take a trip through the grocery store, for example.

We have added to staff in this budget, subject to your affirmative vote, a new full-time position, Director of Technology Ministries. It has become clear to us that the growth in electronic communications, with the equipment and expertise necessary to be effective in it, requires a person trained in the discipline. Our desire, as revealed in the word "Ministries" in the job title, is to find a person who will be dedicated to the life of this parish as are the other called and employed folks you know.

That will, I think, be a challenge. There are folks out there with all the knowledge our job description requires – are they Christians with an understanding of Ministry capital M? Please pray with us – assuming the Voters' adopt the plan that people appropriately equipped both in technical skills and understanding of ministry will be located.

A major objective in honing our communications is outreach, in all meanings of that word. We are so blessed to have so many new members attend and then join our congregation... how can we ensure, going forward, that that blessing continues?

You and I know we are faced with sharply declining percentages of our American population who believe in Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior. We are concerned that means, in the years and decades to come, a shrinking percentage of neighbors seeking a Biblically-based worship and Bible study. Our desire is to present our best face to the world, in services, in communication, even in our physical plant.

We have an Enhancement Committee meeting, looking in to how we might make visiting here as impactful for people as we can. Here's a small thing: we replaced the card tables in the Narthex with attractive wood tables. We've concluded that the 30+ year old bathrooms will benefit from a re-do, probably after Easter 2024. We're looking at landscaping in the courtyard – can that be enhanced? Soon you'll notice new signage on campus, intended to assist visitors find their way around our campus. I know you know your way around. We have had visitors comment that small as we are, directions aren't obvious as they are to us.

Going forward, paint and carpet are under discussion. There is also a forward planning group meeting, looking at the near future, and how we might schedule and afford the upgrades being discussed. I'm writing this in the week before Reformation. I assure you that even as our theology is rooted in Scripture and History, we do look forward. We are, after all, Christian Soldiers marching into the future God has prepared for us.

Wait a second! Look at the verse again! Did you notice what that verse says? "...give thanks in ALL circumstances..." This is why we are not thankful for all circumstances. We are thankful in all circumstances because no matter what we are facing in life... God is still in control and God's presence is still with you. This means that His love, His mercy, His compassion, and all the other wonderful things God is, and does, are still with you. They are with you because you are His dearly loved child. And to prove that, God sent Jesus, His only Son, so that anyone who believes in Him may have eternal life.

So, in this month of reflection on what it is we are thankful for...the thing I'm most thankful for is this...the precious blood shed by Jesus and His victorious resurrection! For it is through this that you are claimed as one of His dear children. I'm thankful that God continues to go with you wherever it is that you go. 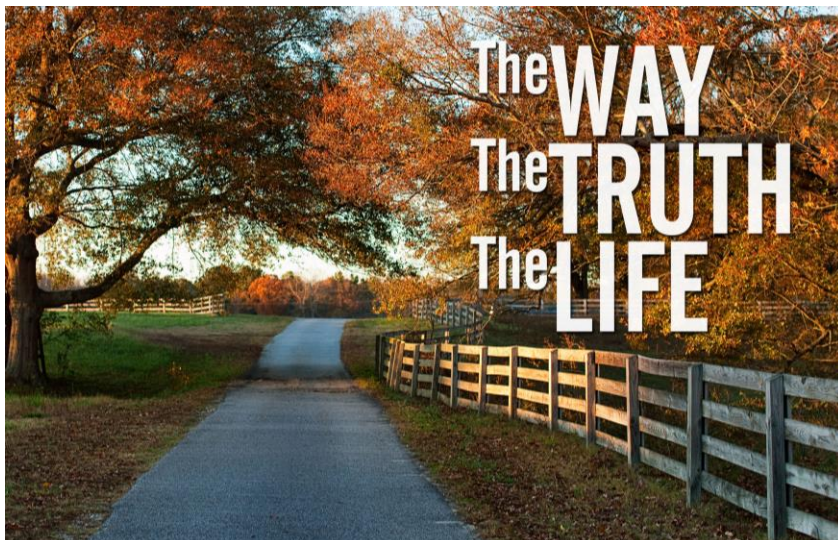
The Council Corner

Our *Surviving the Holidays* seminar offers practical, actionable strategies for making it through the holiday season. These are a few suggestions to help you through this holiday season:

- **ACCEPT YOUR PAIN.** The pain of your loss is unavoidable at this time of year. Healing takes time. Some situations may trigger painful emotions. Remind yourself that it is a season, and it will pass. Journal your emotions.
- **COPING STRATEGIES.** Have the phone numbers of your counselor, pastor, church, close friend, or hotline beside your phone. Commit to calling someone if negative thoughts get too intense. Trained crisis counselors are available anytime by calling or texting 9-8-8 (national crisis hotline) or 844.534.4672 (AZ statewide crisis hotline).
- **EXPECTATIONS.** Lower your expectations. Movies, songs, and promotions create an unrealistic picture of the holidays.
- **GET UP AND MOVE.** Take care of your physical well-being. Healthy foods will give you strength. Exercise is a natural stress reducer.
- **GOD.** Turn to God in prayer and God's Word for daily strength, inspiration, and comfort.
- **GRATITUDE.** Focus on everything for which you are grateful. Journal your gratitude.
- **REACH OUT.** Reach out to other people who might be alone during the holidays through the means available to you, whether in person, by phone, email, Zoom, Skype, FaceTime, cards, or mail.
- **SET BOUNDARIES.** Explain to your family and friends what you can do this year and what you can't do.
- **SOCIALIZE.** Connect with family and friends.
