# | From Pastor Phill

No! No resolutions! I wouldn't keep them up anyway, so why? Unless... let's go at it this way: I resolve to eat more stuff not good for me, spend more than I should, drive way too fast, etc. That way if I don't keep those resolutions, it's a good thing. The lesson: be careful what you resolve to do.

And welcome to a brand New Year, one that, if anything, will fly by even faster than the previous ones. Epiphany is a week away; this year with an early Easter, February 14 is Ash Wednesday, into Lent we go so quickly, and by the end of March Eastertide has come and gone. See what I mean? The year is already flying and you just got this today!

In December we held a special Voters' Assembly at which we determined to call Zachary Mulso to our new position Director of Technology Ministries. I did speak to him that afternoon to let him know, and to ask him to begin considering the Call. The process is not a speedy one; Call docs go to Pacific Southwest District President for signature before moving on to Zach through Concordia University/Mequon's Director of Placement. All that says it will be some weeks before we know whether Zach accepts the Call or returns it.

Now, that new staff position does not mean we need fewer volunteers in the sound booth. There are 3 spots up there that need to be filled by our members, sound board, PowerPoint operator, streaming operator – none of them difficult, all of them easily trained. If you're looking for a way to serve the church on a scheduled but occasional basis, we need you.

In fact, we need you in other places as well: greeters and ushers, easy and enjoyable. Or how about the Bell Choir? We have many more bells than we do ringers – there is a place for you there. Can you sing? Join the Choir. There's room for you in the choir loft as well. So many places to serve – what's on your heart?

The United Methodist Church has in recent years moved away from its once conservative stances on so many issues impacting this world. As a result nearly 2,500 parishes of that denomination have sought "disaffiliation," that is, leaving the denomination. The Episcopal church in this country has experienced the same thing, giving rise to the Anglican church in America. As the media drives public opinion, and the law of the land changes before our eyes, churches come under pressure to abandon Biblical principles in favor of the new morality.

# My Refuge and My Fortress

The loss of a loved one shatters our world. Nothing seems the same. We feel vulnerable and defenseless. How do we go on? The pain wells up and comes upon us like waves of the ocean. We wonder if we will ever feel joy again. Our strength and our resilience come from our Lord. We can trust the Lord to shelter us through this treacherous time.

A helpful practice when we feel adrift amid the turmoil of our emotions is to select a favorite scripture verse that calms our soul. Read the verse aloud at least three times. I recently chose Psalm 91 and read it aloud three times. I was amazed at the sense of calm and reassurance I felt after I completed this practice. I have made this practice part of my morning routine.

### Psalm 91: My Refuge and My Fortress

He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will abide in the shadow of the Almighty.

<sup>2</sup> I will say to the LORD, "My refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust."

<sup>3</sup> For he will deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the deadly pestilence.

<sup>4</sup> He will cover you with his pinions, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness is a shield and buckler.

<sup>5</sup> You will not fear the terror of the night, nor the arrow that flies by day,

<sup>6</sup> nor the pestilence that stalks in darkness, nor the destruction that wastes at noonday.

<sup>9</sup> Because you have made the LORD your dwelling placethe Most High, who is my refuge—

10 no evil shall be allowed to befall you,
no plague come near your tent.

11 For he will command his angels concerning

If For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways.

<sup>14</sup> "Because he holds fast to me in love, I will deliver him;

I will protect him, because he knows my name.

I will be with him in trouble;
I will rescue him and honor him.

<sup>16</sup> With long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation.
