GOD WORKS FOR YOUR GOOD

Romans 8:28 "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to His purpose."

Romans 8:28 is addressed only to those who are loved by God and who love Him. This verse is special, faith strengthening and comforting for all who believe in the Triune God. These words are your assurance that as you live each day and face the challenges that come your way God is always at work in your life for your good.

In good days and days of trials and tribulations, you a believer are not left to meet your needs with your own wisdom and strength. As yesterday's devotion said, the Holy Spirit keeps helping you. His help is not just during occasional times when you are weak. He works in you through God's Word and the Sacraments to strengthen you in your faith constantly. Through these means He assures you your sins are forgiven and through Jesus Christ you are a conqueror over all things.

St. Paul wrote these words to Timothy which are also for you, "the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love, and self-discipline. . . join with me in suffering for the gospel, by the power of God. He has saved us and called us to a holy life—not because of anything we have done but because of His own purpose and grace. This grace was given us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time, but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior, Christ Jesus, who has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. . . I know whom I have believed, and am convinced that He is able to guard what I have entrusted to Him until that day."
