Another interesting month in the life of our church has arrived! February 14 is not only the day you go to Bob's Variety and buy a card, it is also Ash Wednesday... Lent begins early this year because Easter is early, March 31. We at Crown of Life have kept the tradition of Wednesday afternoon services during Lent, and I pray you find your way to joining us for at least some of those.

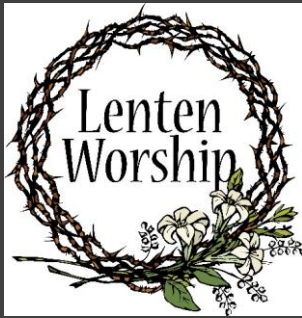
As well in February, a new full-time church worker will begin his career with us – Zachary Mulso has sent his call documents to us, signed, and he is ready to go. Tentatively we will commission and install him on the 18th of February, which date may be movable according to when he will arrive here. Pray for him, please.

Do you have a heart for missions? Our Mission Board meets monthly, and is tasked with wisely investing in the mission field the substantial dollars you members have provided them. Missions has historically sent funds to the Pacific Southwest District, the seminaries in support of seminary students, Valley Lutheran High School, missionary families in Indonesia (Rev. Paul Nelson) and Italy (Rev. Tyler McMiller), Mission Central in Iowa that funds so many LC-MS workers overseas, etc. That etcetera is actually pretty big, as the annual Missions budget is \$132,000, plus their Dedicated Fund of some \$70,000. Please be proud that you as a congregation make possible the spread of the good news of Jesus in a world gone crazy.

Gene Axelson has chaired the board for years and has now stepped down; Diane Hammann has agreed to take the reins in an administrative role, as members of the board bring mission ideas to the table. At our January meeting we agreed to hold a Mission Weekend on February 17 and 18, with a display in the Narthex and other information. Mission Board meets the 2nd Friday of each month at 9AM; if you would like to learn more about the Board and its activities come to the meeting in the office February 9 at 9AM.

Our Enhancement Committee continues to make progress defining projects to, yes, enhance the look and function of our campus. Their immediate concerns are two, landscaping in the courtyard and a re-build of our bathrooms. Why that, you say? Aren't they functioning? Yes, they are. The bathrooms, like the rest of the building, are more than 30 years old. We have the opportunity now to prepare them to last another 30 years. The Committee is reviewing tile, countertops and sinks, paint, floors, etc., and has secured Council permission to proceed, in the spring, to rebuild all four of them.

It's interesting that February is the month of love. Because Valentine's Day is the only item of note that falls in February (aside from Presidents' Day...but that's just too vague). It is the dominant holiday and, what the heck, it's cold out (well, as cold as it gets in AZ) and not a bad time to have warm feelings toward others.

So, I wanted to talk about a *divine* love. When St. John speaks of love in 1st John, he tells us that, "perfect love drives out fear" (1 John 4:18). This is a love that comes from God and is divine. During the winter time there is often fear that accompanies the cold. There is fear of being alone, of having an empty house...of getting caught in the cold. Maybe that's why we invented Valentine's Day, to turn this cold lonely time around. So, it is a time to focus on a love interest or maybe just to flirt. But this divine love is beyond human affection, psychological compatibility, mutual attraction, or even deep interpersonal feelings. These, of course, have value, but what John is talking about is *perfect* love.

This love drives out all fear! This love is a love that we are invited to participate in by God. He wants us to come home to enjoy an intimacy with Him. Even when we are cold and lonely, He is reaching for us with His warm loving arms and bidding us come to Him. His arms are our place of refuge from a world that can be cruel at times...a world that leaves us alone at times even when we are around a lot of people. God wants us to fear not, but come to the place of true belonging. This place is not a place made of human hands or concocted by human minds but is fashioned by God. It is a place that is secure and safe.

Our God is a God that has come to us in our Lord Jesus Christ. He came to dwell with us even when we run from Him. That is His nature. As we are learning as we read through the Bible, He came after the Israelites even when they ran from Him in the desert and He will come for us even when we have let Him down, when we have forgotten Him, or turned our backs on Him. He is a God that has a divine-perfect love...for YOU.

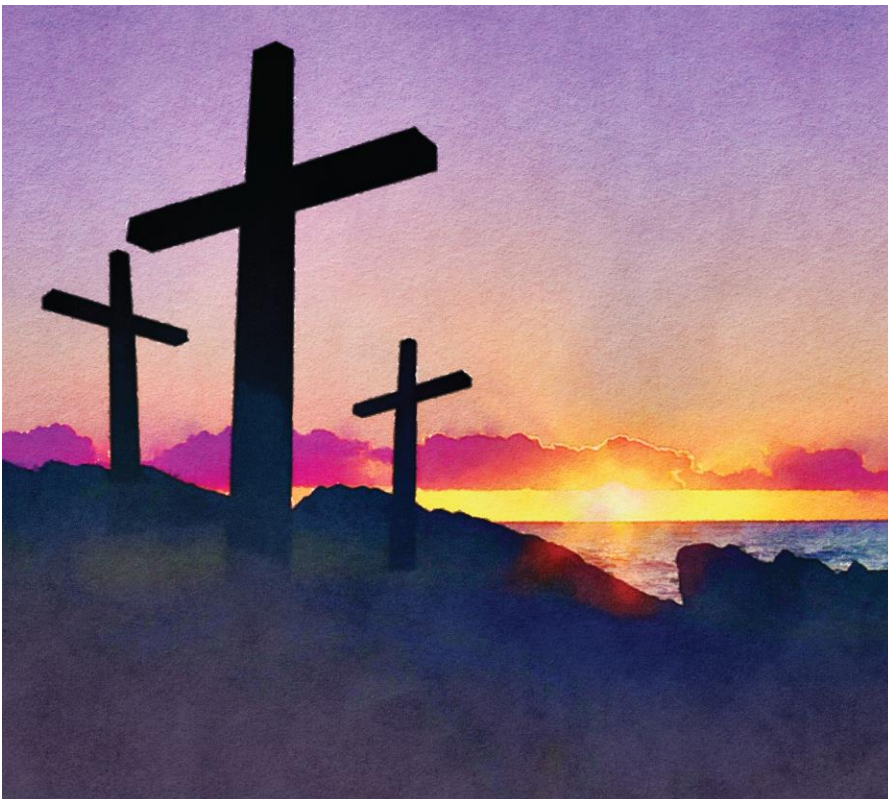

The Sacrificial Love of Our Father

This February 14, we will celebrate, on the same day, Valentine's Day, a day of celebrating love, and Ash Wednesday, a day to meditate on the suffering Christ endured on our behalf. Our pastors may ask us to *Remember: you are dust, and to dust you shall return*. This is a perfect day to reflect on the sacrificial nature of love. Zig Ziglar says ***grief is the price you pay for loving someone***. The origin of love is God. Consider the sacrificial love of our Father, *For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life* (John 3:16).

Through his love for us and his Father, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, came into our world to suffer and die for our sake. When Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord on the 40th day of his birth, in accordance with the Law of Moses, Simeon said to Mary, *Behold this child is appointed for the fall and rising of man in Israel and for a sign that is opposed (and a sword will pierce through your own soul also)* (Luke 2:34-35).

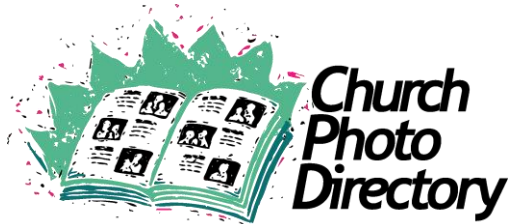
