A SERIES OF DEVOTIONS BASED ON PAUL'S LETTER TO THE CHURCH IN ROME

THE HOUR IS NEAR – PART II

Romans 13:12-13 "The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. So let us put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light. Let us behave decently, as in the daytime, not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and debauchery, not in dissension and jealousy."

"The night is nearly over; the day is almost here." Jesus has said He will return to take you to be with Him. He simply did not say when. The Scriptures say, "you do not know the hour" (Matthew 25:13) and He will return "... at an hour when you do not expect Him." (Matthew 24:44) The "hour is near!" (Yesterday's devotion.)

Jesus told the parable of the wise and foolish virgins (Matthew 25:1-13) to teach the importance of your spiritual preparedness for His return. The foolish virgins were not diligent in their preparedness. The wise virgins realized they had to have extra oil because they did not know when the bridegroom would come. While the foolish ones were away, He returned. When they returned from purchasing more oil for their lamps, they knocked on the door and were not permitted to enter. Those unprepared and not anticipating Jesus' return to Judge the living and the dead think they still have plenty of time. Even though the Scriptures warn that the day is near, many do not take these words to heart.

The writer to the Hebrews exhorts you to be prepared for Jesus' return with these words: "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching." (Hebrews 10:24-25) St. Paul wrote the words of Ephesians 6:10-13 to encourage you to be properly prepared to engage in the spiritual warfare you will become engaged in while you wait for Jesus' return, "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore, put on the full armor of God, so that you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand."

Prayer: Prepared me Lord Jesus through Your Word and the Sacraments for Your return. Amen.
