From Pastor Phill

Greetings in the Name of our Risen Lord, Jesus the Christ! I pray your Easter worship was inspired and inspiring, that the music was terrific, that God touched your hearts in the renewal of faith. We bask now in His grace, walking together toward Pentecost, just a few weeks away now.

Some business at hand for the May Voters' Assembly, to be held Sunday, May 5, following the 9AM service:

When Holly Gast began work among us, 3 years ago now, she nor I recognized that her work here qualifies her to receive, should the congregation vote it, a formal Call to her position. In the process of calling Zach Mulso, the Pacific Southwest District office reviewed Holly's documentation and advised us that yes indeed, she can be called here. She is a graduate of Concordia University/Mequon and served 10 years as Worship Leader at her LCMS parish in Wisconsin. After 5 years in private industry, she and her family prayed for a return to parish ministry in Arizona (relatives are here), and, as God would have it, the opportunity presented itself here at Crown of Life.

What difference for her, given that she is completely entrenched here at Crown? A Call recognizes the formal Synodical education she worked for, for one thing, and for another it says that her work here ain't a job, it's a calling – which, if you have worked with her or been served by her, you know that is how she holds her position here. Called in her heart, let's Call her before God.

In terms of her work here, nothing changes. There is no change in her compensation or our budget. As a Called Worker she can take advantage of the opportunity to take some portion of her income as Housing Allowance – we're getting into details now – which does have some tax advantage for her family, if they choose to use it, and again, no liability or cost to the parish. That same advantage applies to your other Called workers, both pastors and Zach Mulso.

And that's an interesting point, that all of your full-time workers here are Synodically trained and Called – for a small parish, that is not typical. I see it as one of the blessings we enjoy at Crown of Life.

I want to tell you that Denise Trevarrow is co-leading with me; she is a leader and helper already.

Reminder NOTE: When you sign up and pay \$45 for weekend altar flowers, they are yours to take home after the Sunday service or pick up in office during the week.

Both the Elder Board and the Church Council have approved this idea; Elders asked this: given that her family holds membership at a different Missouri Synod congregation (St Mark's, which has services for her kids that we do not), can she be called here? District advised yes, confirmed when I was over there in March. Why then is this a Voters' issue? If it is passed by you, there will be paperwork for me to do, and at some point soon after we will install her here according to her Call.

You may well have a question or comment; please don't hesitate to raise this issue with me, or Holly, or Council President Gene Kuebler, or Elder Board Chair Tom Mertins.

Meanwhile, we continue to worship together as Christians, called each of us into the light of Christ, blessed by the faith He has given us in our baptism, enjoying the company here of other worshipping Lutheran Christians. Now – on to Pentecost!

The Crown of Life Board for Missions received a report, along with a wonderful Thank You letter, with respect to how the monies our donation has played in the advancement of the Student Recruitment Ambassador Program (SRA). The Lord has blessed the Concordia Seminary in St. Louis with an increase in enrollment for the 2023-24 academic year. A total of 130 new students have started their studies at the Seminary this year.

The 2023-24 student enrollment is as follows:

Pastoral Program 358
Deaconess Program 46
Advanced Studies Programs 198
Non-Degree Students 16
Total 618

The 618 enrollment ranks Concordia Seminary, St Louis 25th of the 300 seminaries in the Association of Theological Schools (all denominations). It is the largest of all Lutheran seminaries. And, the Seminary is on track for another increase in the enrollment of new Master of Divinity students.

Did you get goose bumps? Hope you did. God is blessing COL members' contributions in the SRA program in amazing ways.


