# **From Pastor Phill**

Πασχα is Greek to me, how about you? Say it "paskah." The word is translated into English as Passover. The King James uses the word Passover in the New Testament every time the Greek "paskah" occurs except once, Acts 12:4 – Peter is arrested by Herod, jailed, with the intention to bring him out after Easter and present him as a sacrifice to the Jews. The folks that put the King James together wanted to attach this happening to Easter, which makes sense, in Acts. So when you hear/read the word "pascal" to describe Easter, you know its origin, which initially was used only in reference to the miracle of the Passover (Exodus 12).

The Old Testament Hebrew uses a variant of the word paskah 49 times – it was a vitally important moment and concept for them, so they had to invent a word to describe it. Fun stuff, yes? So then that Greek word "paskah" is a transliteration. That is, the sound and the meaning of the original Aramaic-then-Hebrew word was borrowed and moved into Greek, as that language had no word for the event.

So from all that, where do we get the word Easter? Bede the Venerable (that wild and crazy 7<sup>th</sup> century monk who lived in England) wrote down what seems plausible at least to me, but then I'm a Bede fan. He says that early Christians borrowed the name of a goddess of spring, Eostre (that's in the Northumbrian language, where Bede lived), a false god that tracks back even further. So the spring equinox rolled around, planting time, a sun event noted by many pre-historic people (think Stonehenge, think the Casa Grande monument north of Tucson, think the Mayans, etc). Hey, it's the equinox, let's have a feast, name the goddess Eostre, and get on with the party.

The Lord, in His wisdom, caused the Passover to coincide with planting time, the spring equinox, etc, and then caused His one and only Son to be sacrificed for us at that same time. Convenient holy planning, as every culture everywhere recognized that time as significant in their lives, and God allowed Christians to fit right in with those pre-existent celebrations, as He eclipsed them all with a salvation meant for everyone. So we have a spring party in the church, a party celebrating God's plan for us, His grace toward us, His love and forgiveness on display for all the world to see in the resurrection of the Paschal Lamb. We call it Easter.

This is an early Easter. The earliest ever was March 20, 1818 – it won't happen that early for another 250 years, so don't wait for that...

## From Pastor Mark

Sometimes something old can be the source of something new.

The stresses and tensions that we have been through lately have left many people struggling to cope. It feels like just as we find our way through one storm, another strikes from a different direction.

In such times as this, the inclination may be to look for a new strategy, a new way forward and out. Then again, sometimes something old can be the source of something new.

Lent is that something old that can lead to something new. When you participate in something that has been around for thousands of years, it anchors you. It reminds you that your current circumstance has a context. It says to you that there is always a next chapter. As we are entering the Easter Season and are observing Lent, I hope you have benefitted from the sermon series we have going on here at Crown of Life.

This year's series strives to address popular assumptions of postmodernism. Postmodernism is an elastic term, not easily defined, but it meets us almost daily in life and in ministry. Its subtle influences are found in all age groups, not just young people. No longer is there one morality or myth or ritual or dance or dream or philosophy or concept of self or God or culture or style of art that predominates. The explosion of new communications technologies and the continuing fragmentation of cultures into thousands of little cultures has forced us to view our world as simultaneously expanding and shrinking. This is what "Life Together" in a postmodern world is all about. To understand and find a foothold in a topsy-turvy world around us can help us to be able to help others in our life.

I encourage you to connect with the Season of Lent this year. I hope you will appreciate its history and take the initiative to make this time of spiritual renewal your own. It needn't be the solemn time that it traditionally has been, but it should be a time of re-centering yourself in your faith...even in a postmodern world.

Lent has an important place in the chaos of our lives and our world. It is an invitation to slow down long enough to remember that God is with us even through the craziest of times—even in the "crucifixion" times in our lives—with the promise of healing and new life. If you are able, I would invite you to please join us for worship as we hear the witness of these people in John's Gospel.

Then let us all come together in a great Easter celebration! We have much to be thankful for! We are growing as a church, we are financially blessed, many of us are growing closer to God through reading through the Bible, we have each other, and we have a loving Lord that is in control of all that is going on. So, let us trust in Him as we look to the future see what "something new" He has in *store* for us!

## The Board for Missions Thanks You



Free-will offerings will be accepted.


# **Email Prayer Group**


