GOD'S HOUSE – PART II

Hebrews 3:6 "But Christ is faithful as the Son over God's house. And we are His house, if indeed we hold firmly to our confidence and the hope in which we glory."

As you read in yesterday's devotion, you are a member of the household of God. (See 1 Corinthians 3:16 and 1 Timothy 3:15) The writer to the Hebrews has more to say here in verse 6 about this house created by Christ Jesus. First, he says that Jesus is the one who is over, who has control and authority over God's house and all those who live within it. Jesus is the reason why those who live in God's house are there and secondly, He is responsible for them remaining.

The verse continues, "And we are His house. . ." Think of this. By virtue of your baptism and that you have received God's gift of faith in Jesus you are His house. You are a resident, a participant in all that occurs there, and have all the rights and privileges God grants to all who reside with Him there.

This is true, the writer says, "If indeed (you) hold firmly to (your) confidence and the hope in which (you) glory." As the opening words of yesterday's hymn said, your hope, this hope to which the writer refers, is "built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness." Read carefully the verses of hymn 645 (LSB) found below that have more to say about why you can be confident, you can hold firmly to the hope you have God will keep you in His household even into all eternity.

It is by God's grace you hold firmly with confidence and hope in the glory God has promised you in Christ Jesus. God is faithful in keeping His promises. The promise you have through His Son is, ". . . be faithful unto death and I will give you the crown of everlasting life." (Revelation 2:10) In the meantime you live confident in Jesus' promise, "I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one will snatch them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand." (John 10:28-29)

Prayer: Jesus, keep me always a resident in God's house. Amen.
