# From Pastor Phill

Did you know that Crown of Life Lutheran Church has a Constitution? Yup, we have ByLaws and an Employee Handbook, Policies and Procedures – all of it. And we live to those tenets, too, as we are an Arizona Non-Profit Corporation. The Voters' Assemblies we have in November and May are, in essence, our stockholders' meetings. When was the last time you looked at our Constitution? You might have missed:

#### **Our Mission Statement**

The mission of this congregation shall be to witness the saving grace of Jesus Christ to His entire world. To accomplish this mission, we preach the Word of God, administer the sacraments, provide religious instruction for all our people, and encourage the growth of God's church through mission work.

We are a mission church, having been birthed by Fountain of Life/Sun City in the 1980s. We, in turn, birthed Word of Life/Surprise in the early 2000s. The mission of Christ is in our DNA. About 14% of our expenditures every year are dedicated to mission work in this country and so many others, including grants to Lutheran schools from preschool to university in order that we have a role in raising up the next generation of Christians and their pastors. Our Mission Board, through your generosity, funds mission in the Southwest Pacific, Italy, Haiti, and around the world.

The ways in which the Mission Statement is played out in our parish are obvious. Each week we read and speak God's word in our services – after all the Lord Himself says: "... faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ" (Romans 10:17). We are blessed to have 6 weekly Bible studies, led by studied, faithful teachers. We've been graced lately by several baptisms, and the Sacrament of the Table is made available weekly. "Portals of Prayer" is available to any who desire to have it; as is Pastor Mirly's daily devotional series.

To the community around us we are pleased to offer our GriefCare program, so appropriate in an area where loss is such a part of lives. The Care Ministry at Crown offers lectures, open to the public, on topics from audiology to residential and in-home care and beyond. Weekly, in the school year, Schole meets on our campus, providing a home for that interesting home school program. Have you been to any of the concerts we provide? Hope so.

A Word about Mission & Vision

#### The Mission

Our Mission Statement: "The mission of this congregation shall be to witness the saving grace of Jesus Christ to His entire world. To accomplish this mission, we preach the Word of God, administer the Sacraments, provide religious instruction for all our people, and encourage the growth of God's church through mission work."

Biblical Mission: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit..." Matthew 28:19.

#### The Vision

So, vision has to do with **Who** we want to be in the *future*... For example:

- People who love God and others.
- People who learn to be and make disciples.
- People who lead others to discover and live out their calling as God's Children.

We are <u>His</u> church placed in a specific location at a specific time for a specific purpose. We gather as a vital living extension of Jesus Christ. We gather not as an assortment of individuals, but as an interconnected, relational network. We gather not for our own pleasure, but for Christ's. We gather to praise Him and encounter Him in new and meaningful ways, and to be shaped by His word. We gather to understand how we can better serve our community in the name of Jesus!

And What would we want to be...

You arrive on Saturday or Sunday and see smiles on people's faces, hear joy in people's voices, feel genuine excitement, and it's contagious. Loving, engaged people are hanging out in the narthex before and after church. Every visitor is greeted and feels thoroughly welcomed. All because God's presence is abundantly evident.

Crown of Life has become the center of neighborhood activities and social events. We have an amazing pool of volunteers and enthusiastic participants in our ministries and in community service. We are effectively reaching more people outside our church walls through people and technology.

The possibilities are endless. It's the church I want to be a part of, don't you? Are we there yet? No. Can we get there? Absolutely, by God's grace. Crown of Life's leadership shares this vision for our ministry, but it requires people, both staff and volunteers.

Vision, as modeled in Scripture and throughout church history, came as God's people saw the needs around them and then sought God for what He wanted them to do. Moses' leading the people of Israel out of Egypt, David's fighting Goliath, Nehemiah's rebuilding the temple wall, Paul's writing to the church in Corinth — these and other accounts in Scripture indicate the vision of these leaders. They saw in their minds a future that was preferred more than the present. And their vision propelled them forward to do courageous things.

Aubrey Malphurs, in his book, *Planting Growing Churches* for the 21st Century writes, "People can't focus on fog! As someone once said, 'If you aim at nothing, you will hit it every time!'" He further states, "[Vision] is the ministry compass that helps a congregation and the leaders navigate through the ocean of decision."

All churches fit into two categories: 1) Those with vision have a sense of direction and destiny. 2) Those without vision seem lost and befuddled. A church that develops a vision puts a compass in the hands of its people. Instead of the pastor and leadership pulling and pushing, the people have a common sense of destiny.

Are we called to witness our faith to our friends, neighbors, and people in our lives? Are we called to be more purposeful in putting together events that are "non-threatening" for one to mix with our membership? Should we be inviting in more ways and more frequently?

We are doing many things right at Crown of Life...even this summer! We will continue to study God's Word through Reading Scripture and all of the other Bible Studies offered here. We will invite children and families for VBS again. We will welcome new members into our midst. We will continue our confirmation of young people. We will welcome our brothers and sisters back. We will have an Oktoberfest celebration to invite people to in the Fall, have another cantata and then Christmas! Wow!

Let us do ALL of these things with Godly PURPOSE and a Vision!

Grief Share Thessalonians 4:13 states, But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have

no hope. Nevertheless, after the death of a loved one, we may question whether we will ever feel joy again. Where can we turn to claim the steadfast hope that we will experience joy again after a devastating loss?

The first place we can turn to is God's Word. Throughout the Bible, God reassures us that he loves us, protects us, and has our lives in His hands. God also created us for a purpose in this world. These are a few scripture verses we can turn to strengthen our confidence that joy will return.

- We wait in <u>hope</u> for the Lord; he is our help and our shield. In him, our hearts rejoice, for we <u>trust</u> in his holy name. May your unfailing love be with us, Lord, even as we put our hope in you (Psalm 33:20-22).
- Cast me not away from your presence, and take not your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit (Psalm 51:11-12).
- Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob, whose **hope** is in the Lord his God, who made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, who keeps faith forever (Psalm 146:5-6).
- Many are the sorrows of the wicked, but steadfast love surrounds the one who **trusts** in the Lord. Be glad in the Lord, and rejoice, O righteous, and shout for joy, all you upright in heart (Psalm 32:10-11).
- For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope (Jeremiah 29:11).
- For in this **hope** we were saved. Now **hope** that is seen is not **hope**. For who **hopes** for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience (Romans 8:24-25).
- He will render to each one according to his works: to those who by <u>patience</u> in well-doing seek for glory and honor and immortality, he will give eternal life (Ephesians 2:6-7).

We can also find healing, comfort, and strength in our worship services, church activities, and spending time with our Christian family.
