Finally. Construction — inside — is complete. As you see we've painted all spaces, and the four original bathrooms have been redone. In addition we added, in the East end of the Narthex, a handicapped, family bathroom, created in the space the Nurse's Office used to be. That was done at the request of 2 of our Elders, both of whom had wheelchair-bound wives, and really needed a disability appropriate facility. That door, by the way, has a lock on the inside handle, so privacy is assured.

A project not yet complete is the replanting of the Courtyard area, which will be undertaken in November – now ain't the time to put new plants in. Summer is tough enough on us old plants... And then there is flooring in the Narthex and Sanctuary, at this time planned for spring of 2025.

Some folks have asked about the process of determining what improvements to make, and oh, by the way, where the money comes from for these, in my view at least, necessary improvements. The process of deciding what to do has been in the hands of an Enhancement Committee, charged with considering what visitors to our church will see, really an outreach function; their recommendations were then discussed and approved by Church Council. We could live with what we're used to, right? But - - we want the best impression possible for visitors.

We have been so blessed by the stewardship of our congregation that we had been able, 25 years ago, to establish a Dedicated Fund for repair and replacement of aging equipment and fixtures. Good thing too — we've been engaged in replacing the air conditioning units; mid-August we had a failure, the new one cost \$27,000, and we had the money. Total cost for the recent painting, bathroom remodel, and upcoming Courtyard landscaping is about \$140,000, and we have those funds too.

Next year's flooring replacement will approach \$100,000 although we do not have those numbers in hand just yet. Why, you say – looks fine to me! Do look around. The carpet in the Narthex and Sanctuary is 18 years old, has held up well, and when you begin to notice, does need to be redone.

Your Church Council has been excellent in the management of the funds you have donated to this parish.

Here's how it works:

- 1) Sign up at the Information Desk,
- 2) Groups of 3-4 couples and/or singles will be assigned,
- 3) A lead couple will be the first host and will contact the rest of the group,
- 4) The lead couple can either host the dinner or arrange for eating out. If eating in, the host provides the main dish and the others bring the salad and dessert, etc.,

⁹ Because you have made the Lord your dwelling place — the Most High, who is my refuge

¹¹ For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways.

¹²On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone.

¹⁴ "Because he holds fast to me in love, I will deliver him; I will protect him, because he knows my name.
