From Pastor Phill

How dare you say that in church! I was recently admonished that, in church, nothing said of a political nature is appropriate – after all, we believe in separation of church and state. So do I. So did Thomas Jefferson – what follows is a quote from the National Park Service website, NPS.gov:

Thomas Jefferson, in his letter to the Danbury Baptists reiterates that religion is a matter which lies solely between Man & his God, that he owes account to none other for his faith or his worship, that the legitimate powers of government reach actions only, & not opinions, I contemplate with sovereign reverence that act of the whole American people which declared that their legislature should "make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof," thus building a wall of separation between Church & State.

The doctrine of separation of church and state, stated in the Constitution, means that no government in this nation may establish a religion and require our fealty to it. The authors referred, of course, to the Church of England, established by their government. If you dissented, that is, adhered to a different confession of Christ, you could be jailed. No wonder the framers wrote that possibility out of our Constitution!

In 1954 Eisenhower signed a law, spoken of as the Johnson Amendment, sponsored by Lyndon Johnson, that essentially threatened the non-profit status of an organization that *endorsed a particular candidate*. Italics are mine. Behind that, interestingly, was Johnson's desire to muzzle two non-profits that were campaigning against him, having branded him a "closet Communist." The law threatened non-profit status.

"The Johnson Amendment prohibits registered 501(c)(3) organizations — which include some religious congregations but also other nonprofits — from endorsing political candidates and participating in political campaigns, at the risk of losing their nonprofit status."

That's a quote from the Religious News Service (RNS) website, May 4, 2017, the day President Trump signed an Executive Order gutting enforcement of that law, under which enforcement has been attempted only a few times, twice against churches.

The impact of the Johnson Amendment was intended to be exactly the opposite of what the First Amendment of the Constitution says. Remember, the Constitution says the government will not interfere in freedom of religion;

the Johnson Amendment said non-profits dare not speak about candidates, or campaign for them, and now even that won't be enforced.

Doesn't matter. We Missouri Synod Lutherans get nervous when our pastors veer too close to the political – see the first line of this article. We should stick, in the pulpit, to Biblical truths and not get caught up in cultural conflict, right?

What about instances in which Biblical truth directly conflicts with the culture into which those truths are preached? Should the church be silent on Biblical issues such as murder when the culture has deemed that word does not apply to the unborn? If I say that abortion without limits is celebrated by one party's platform, note, not a candidate, and preach that murder is wrong in God's eyes, is that political speech? Pick another issue, same-sex marriage, yes, the law of the land, yes, sin in the eyes of God. Should the preacher ignore the insult to God's Word of that law in order not to offend listeners who believe in that legal freedom? Why come to church if not to hear what God says in His Word? His Word condemns behavior and His Word saves the sinner, and we ought to hear it all.

So, how about this: I won't endorse a political candidate from the pulpit. I cannot in good conscience refrain from decrying the tilt away from God's truths we are experiencing in this nation; you can, are free to, decide whether there are parties or candidates or laws or propositions that support or oppose that increasing anti-Biblical tilt, and whether or not to vote for any of them. But, coming to Crown of Life, don't be surprised to hear words from me that run counter to the cultural norms around us. We are a counter-culture church.

And we are a church that recognizes Scripture as the source and norm of the teaching in the church; we are a church that recognizes each of us is a fallen, sinful human being; we are a church that recognizes we are condemned to hell without the intervention of the Man on the cross, the One who died that we may be free of eternal punishment; and we are a church that sings and prays and communes together at the foot of the cross no matter what the rest of the world might think of us.

May God bless us all as we navigate the interminable calls, texts, ads, and other interferences from the political world in this season. This is the month of Oktoberfest and Reformation – let's dwell on those cultural norms!

As the temperature becomes a little cooler around here (at least in the morning!), we are reminded that October is upon us—a time when many celebrate Halloween, or as it was once known, "All Hallows' Eve." This day has its roots in Christian tradition as the eve of All Saints' Day, a time to remember the saints who have gone before us in faith. However, for many, it has become a night filled with costumes, spooky decorations, and candy. As Christians, we have the opportunity to engage with this cultural celebration in a meaningful way, not with fear but with faith, courage, and love.

In Isaiah 35:4-5, we hear God's reassuring words: *"Say to those who have an anxious heart, 'Be strong; fear not! Behold, your God will come with vengeance, with the recompense of God. He will come and save you.' Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped."*

These words remind us that even in the midst of uncertainty (and there is plenty of that these days), darkness, or fear, we have no reason to be anxious (even with the upcoming elections!). Our God is with us, mighty to save, and He calls us to be lights in the world. This message is particularly relevant during this season. While Halloween can sometimes focus on images of fear and darkness, we are called to be people of light, sharing the hope and peace we have in Christ.

Instead of withdrawing from Halloween or seeing it as something to be avoided, let us seize this moment to engage our community! Just as Jesus stepped into the world to bring light into darkness, we can use this time to reach out to our neighbors - and sharing a kind word is a simple way to be present in the lives of those around us, perhaps even giving a word of encouragement or an invitation to church. It's an opportunity to open doors—both literally and figuratively—for conversations about faith, family, and the hope we have in Jesus.

We are arranging with the parents and children of Schole to go to Solstice (at their request) to have a little celebration in which we can be that light.

October is Pastor Appreciation Month. They are heralds of the cross! Be sure to tell them how special they are to you!

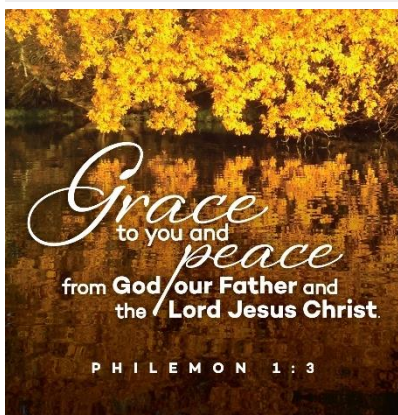

The following items are to be placed in the box age and gender appropriate. No additions, deletions, or substitutions. Do not add money, photos, or personal notes.

Coloring book

Crayons (24-count box)

Plastic or rubber ball (tennis ball is okay)

Stuffed animal (Beanie Baby size - Beanie Baby is okay)

New toothbrush - in package

1 pair new socks non-packaged (gender and age-appropriate)
