Somehow around our house and in my office, there's always a bunch of old paper to be ground up so I look forward to that.

Now, looking backward, February has always been busy in the church at large:

1 February 1528 Patrick Hamilton, a leader of Reformation in Scotland, burned at the stake as a heretic

3 February 1518 Pope Leo X orders the Augustinian Order to discipline Martin Luther for his writings

7 February 1528 Reformation was officially established in Bern, Switzerland

14 February 1546 Martin Luther preached his final sermon, on Matthew 11:28

18 February 1546 Martin Luther died

20 February 1620 Rasmus Jensen died at Hudson Bay, Canada; he was the first Lutheran pastor to serve in North America

24 February 1520 Charles V, at 20, crowned Holy Roman Emperor. Charles condemned Luther at Worms, but later was tolerant of Luther and his followers – for political reasons...

28 February 1870 Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod dedicated the first plant of Concordia Publishing House

Busy month, historically. Truthfully, I pray this February is more peaceful than some of those days. Peace, however, is never guaranteed, even for believers in our Lord Jesus Christ. You've read Revelation, right? We are always a breath away from the next natural disaster, and somehow the destruction they bring seems greater than in earlier days of my life – perhaps that's just a trick of my aging brain.

### Ordering Church Altar Flowers?

To order flowers for the altar on a certain weekend, sign the flower book with your name on the line on the week you want the flowers on the altar. If you have a color preference please note that, and the purpose for your flowers (such as anniversary, birthday, or in memory of).

Your order must be written in this book before the 15th of the month before the date needed. This will allow proper ordering and will ensure it will appear in the Jewels.

The donation for each arrangement is \$45.00 unless you would like special flowers added (i.e., roses). Then an extra charge will be added.

You can pay for your flowers by placing a check in the collection plate. Make sure to write "flowers" on the memo line.

The flowers are yours and can be taken home after Sunday's service. If you don't attend the Sunday service you will be able to get your flowers from the church office at your convenience.

### **From Pastor Mark**

Dear Church Family,

As we step into February, a month often associated with love, I want to take a moment to reflect on a different kind of love...one that binds us together during seasons of change. Life is full of transitions: new beginnings, endings, and everything in between. Change can be unsettling at times, but it also provides opportunities for growth, renewal, and a deeper dependence on God.

In Ecclesiastes 3:1, we are reminded that, "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens..." Change is part of God's design, a pattern of change is constant in all of our lives. While the seasons may shift, our anchor remains in God's unchanging nature: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8).

As a congregation, we may find ourselves navigating change together this year. We will have a retirement, a possible call, an interim pastor, a welcoming of new members, a possible embracing of new ministries, or just generally adapting to new circumstances. These moments challenge us to practice LOVE in tangible ways, reflecting the heart of Christ in all things.

In John 13:34-35, Jesus gives us a clear command: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." Loving one another through change requires patience, understanding, and a willingness to walk alongside one another, even when the road feels uncertain.

Let me illustrate this with a simple example. Imagine a potter shaping a lump of clay on the wheel. The clay undergoes a transformation...stretched, molded, and refined...until it becomes a shape of beauty and purpose. Similarly, God uses the changes in our lives to shape US into His image, but the process can be messy and uncomfortable. During these times, our love for one another becomes a vital support system, reminding us of His presence and faithfulness.

So how can we love each other well through change?

- 1. Pray for One Another Lift each other up in prayer, asking God for wisdom, strength, and peace. Philippians 4:6 encourages us, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."
- 2. Encourage and Listen A kind word or a listening ear can be a balm to the soul. As 1 Thessalonians 5:11 reminds us, "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing."
- 3. Be Patient and Forgiving Change can bring challenges, but we are called to bear with one another in love. Colossians 3:13 urges us to "bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you."
- 4. Serve One Another Acts of service demonstrate Christ's love in action. Galatians 5:13 says, "Serve one another humbly in love."

As we journey together, let us embrace the changes ahead with hearts anchored in faith and hands extended in love. God has great plans for our church, and I believe He will use this season to draw us closer to Him and to one another. I am grateful for each of you and pray that we continue to grow together as a family of faith. May we step forward with courage, grace, and love, trusting in God's perfect plan for our lives and our church.

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it

is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. All these are empowered by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills (1 Corinthians 12:4 -11 ESV).

The Spirit of the Lord is active in every ministry here at Crown of Life Lutheran Church. You can find a listing of our church ministries at the information desk.

Our Care Ministry serves our church family in practical ways that express our love and concern for each other. In 2024, we served **185 meals** and made **291 visits or calls.** Our handyman/technology team assisted people with home and technology needs **49 times**. Contact any of our team leaders listed below with questions or requests.

Thank you for attending Dr. Tiffany Hughes' presentation in December 2024. Dr. Hughes shared tips from Alzheimer's research on ways to lower our risk for cognitive decline as we age. These tips include:

- 1. Engage in regular cardiovascular exercise that elevates heart rate and increases blood flow.
- 2. Stimulate your brain by taking a local college community center or online class.
- 3. Lower your cardiovascular disease and stroke risk factors-obesity, high blood pressure, and diabetes.
- 4. Quit smoking.
- 5. Protect your head from injury.
- 6. Eat a balanced diet that is higher in vegetables and fruit.
- 7. Stay socially engaged.
- 8. Get a minimum of 6 hours of sleep, preferably 7-8 hours at night.
- 9. Challenge your brain. Learn a new skill or hobby, play strategy games, like bridge.
- 10. Take care of your mental health. Seek treatment if you have depression, anxiety, or stress.


