From Pastor Phill

The calendar moves, one day follows another, and whatever is planned out ahead of us gets nearer every day. And here we are in March. The word is from Latin, Martius, the dictionary telling me that means "of or pertaining to the god of war, Mars." In the Roman calendar of Jesus' time March had become the third month of the year, which sounds familiar to us. Jesus also lived under the Hebrew calendar; what we know as March spans two months in the Hebrew calendar, Adar and Nissan.

Jesus would have celebrated the Feast of Purim, or Lots, in the month of Adar. This year that Jewish festival is sundown the 13th of March to sundown the 14th of March. It recognizes that time in the life of the Jewish exiles when a minister to the king decided to kill all the Jews in Babylon, having them draw lots to see who died when. You can read about this terrible moment in the Book of Esther in your Old Testament. The miracle, of course, is that God placed Esther, one of the Jewish exiles, to become wife to the king, able to convince him to kill that minister and not her people. When you read Esther, note that God is never mentioned – but His saving work for His people is front and center. That idea is familiar to Christians.

March is a busy month for Crown of Life, beginning with Ash Wednesday, March 5. Two services that day, with a dinner in the Parish Hall between. Ash Wednesday is an ancient observance for Christians, perhaps dating back before the 10th century AD. It is the beginning of Lent, the 40 day (excluding Sundays!) preparation for Easter (April 20 this year). We celebrate Ash Wednesday with communion services, and at your choice, the imposition of a cross of ash. That mark of ash, and the communion that follows, demonstrates our sinfulness, and the forgiveness of sin won for us at the Cross of Calvary.

Other things in March too, as you'll see in this newsletter, for example Missions Weekend the 15th and 16th of March – Crown is a powerful missions presence in the world and you'll hear more about that. And then the Youth Orchestra will play at Crown on Friday, March 28, at 7PM – an unusual time, for us, for a presentation, but those students and their moms and dads need time to assemble in far away Sun City West... Don't miss that concert.



(Hebrews 12:1-2)

If we look to Jesus and trust God to sustain us and guide us during our bewildering journey through grief, we will also find new meaning, joy, and purpose as we emerge from our grief stronger, more resilient, and more loving. If we persevere in faith and prayer, our relationship with the Lord will become more vital and profound than ever. If we keep our focus on the One who is guiding us, joy will return.

As we reflect on the intense pain and suffering Christ willingly took upon himself for our salvation, we can sense Jesus walking by our side, loving us, comforting us, and strengthening us on our journey of healing from the death of a loved one. We know with certainty, *The Lord is near the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit*. (Psalm 34:18)

If you are grieving the loss of your spouse, please join us on **Tuesday, March 25, from 9:30 am to 11:30 am** for our "**Loss of a Spouse Seminar."** At this encouraging seminar, you will gain insight into the following:

- How to handle overwhelming emotions.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is transforming the way we interact with technology, and one of the most advanced AI tools available today is ChatGPT. ChatGPT is an AI-powered assistant designed to process and generate human-like text, helping users find information, draft content, and engage in meaningful discussions. In the church setting, AI like ChatGPT can be a powerful tool for ministry. If any of you thought that the two paragraphs above didn't sound like the way I write, you are right, those were written by ChatGPT. AI is one of the tools that I find to be extremely helpful in ministry. I don't ask it to write sermons or anything like that, I ask it to create an outline or expand on a thought and then I convert it to my words. While AI isn't perfect, it has the potential to do a lot of cool things, like generate images, create videos, and even change a song to have someone else's voice in it. AI is an amazing tool if it's used properly, and it's one example of how technology is rapidly changing.

Travel With Pastor Vern In 2025

As many of you know, Pastor Vern has been putting together some interesting trips with unique destinations over the past few years.

The 2025 schedule includes trips to the Southwest Canyons in Arizona and Utah, The ARK in Kentucky, The Pageant of the Masters in Laguna Beach, CA, and the "unique" attractions of Palm Springs, CA.

In addition, he has scheduled three unique trips to Saxony, Germany to visit one of the missions that **Crown of Life** supports: "The Kerkermeister Guest House and English Language School."
